2.35pm Existing Evidence on Segregation and Spatial Inequality: Prof Geoff Meen² and Kenneth Gibb³

(40 mins presentation plus 20 mins discussion)

Abstract: Spatial patterns of segregation and deprivation have remained relatively constant over the last twenty to thirty years. This causes particular problems for policies aimed at promoting mixed communities. Can they really be successful or are they fighting against deep-seated market trends? Case study evidence suggests that, over much longer periods (300 years), the substantial changes that take place tend to be dramatic rather than gradual. The implication is that areas can eventually change to a different state, but typically the shocks have to be large. Although it is not currently possible to build a model of the last 300 years, we set out a short-run framework that is consistent with stability over 20-30 years, but has the potential to exhibit major changes over the long run. The presentation tries to show how interactions between migration patterns, local housing markets and deprivation bring this about. Thresholds or take-off points are an important part of the story. The results suggest that "one size fits all" policies are not appropriate and spatial targeting is necessary. But getting the most deprived areas to the take-off point is likely to be expensive. Harpurhey in Manchester is taken as an example.

3.50pm Prospects for Regional Housing Market Inequalities: Dr Eric Levin³

(20 mins presentation plus 5 mins discussion)

Abstract: Why is the UK construction industry so unresponsive to house price signals? This paper attempts to explain why house price movements generated by real interest rates changes cause weaker supply responses than house price movements caused by other factors, such changes in the expected rental value. This provides a theoretical basis for arguing that house price movements caused by changes in real interest rates are associated with a lower price elasticity of supply in countries, regions and areas where land represents a relatively high proportion of the cost of building a house. The paper offers some discussion of how we might be able to disentangle long term interest rate effects from those of other drivers of house prices and how spatial differences in house price inflation could prove key to solving the conundrum.

4.15pm Prospects for Sub-Regional Housing Market Inequalities: Dr Gwilym Pryce³

(20 mins presentation plus 5 mins discussion)

Absract: This session will look at new emerging concerns for sub-regional inequalities: (a) The implications of rising sea levels and flood risk for future house price inequalities. Will properties located high above sea level appreciate at a faster pace than lower-elevation properties as flood risk and flood intensity increases? What are the social implications? Perhaps only the richest households will be able to afford low-flood-risk properties and racial and socioeconomic divisions will increasingly have a topological dimension. (b) Density Divides: Current housing policy seeks to meet housing shortages through a programme of high density development. However, there is evidence to suggest that low-density properties are already rising in value at a faster rate than high-density properties. Increasing the supply of high-density properties will, other things being equal, further increase the disparity in house price appreciation between low-density and high-density housing. Current policy will therefore further exacerbate the polarisation of wealth (which is already outstripping the rate of polarisation of income).


