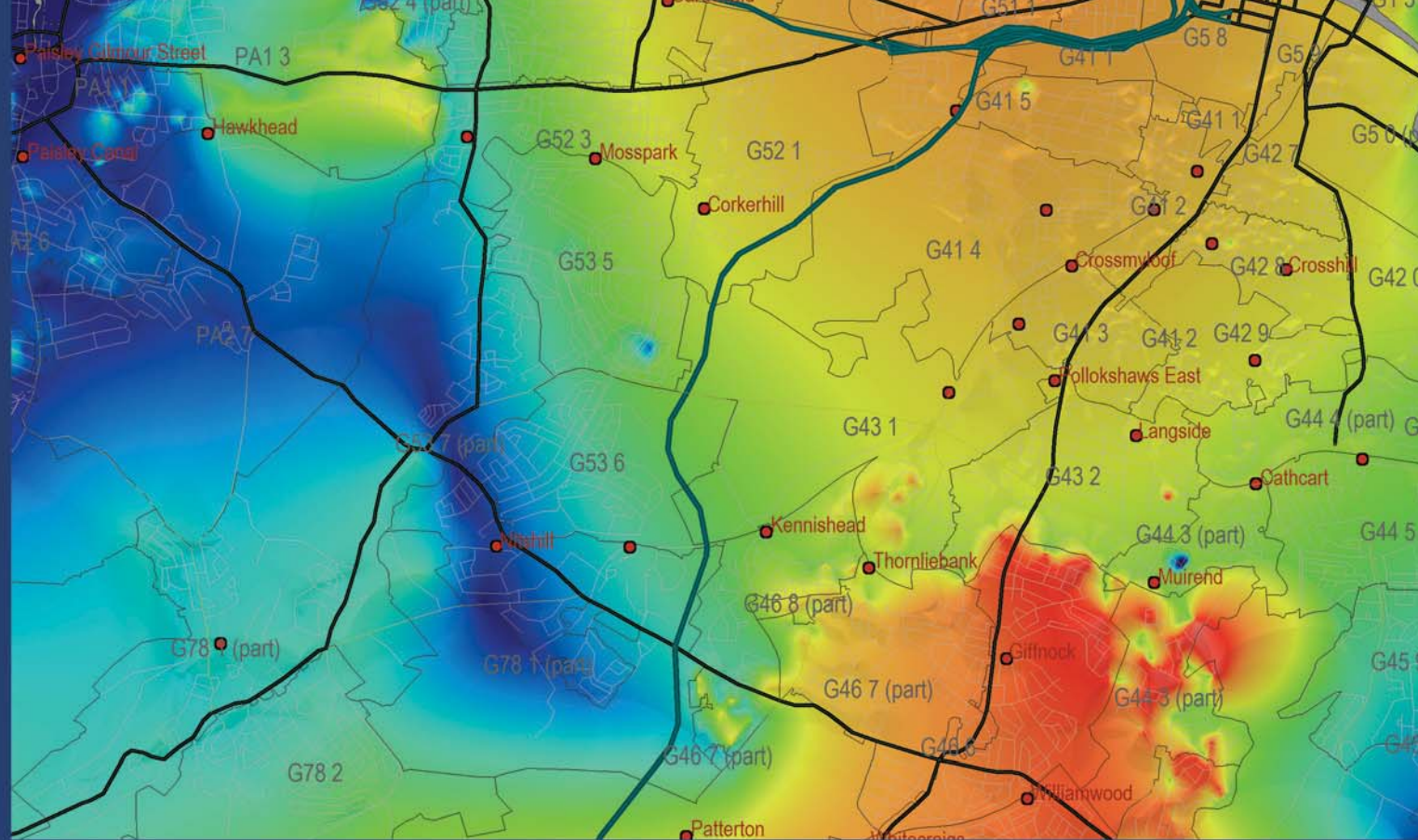


The University

The University of Glasgow is one of the United Kingdom's oldest and most prestigious universities, with an international reputation for its research and teaching and an important role in the cultural and commercial life of the country. With almost 16,000 undergraduate and 4,000 postgraduate students studying in nine faculties, it is one of the country's largest universities. Employing over 5,800 staff, it is a major employer in the city and, with an annual turnover of £278M, it makes a substantial contribution to the local economy. The University is a member of the Russell Group of elite research-led universities and has one of the largest research bases in the UK, with an income from research grants and contracts of some £75M in 2003-04 and over 3,400 researchers.

Flexibility

Our research training Masters degree programmes have been developed around a common framework. Students will typically take the four Core Courses listed in the diagram opposite, plus two options and a dissertation.¹ So if you're not sure exactly which Masters programme you want to do but you do know that you want to improve your core research skills, you can enrol on the Core Courses in the knowledge that you can always select your Masters programme once you have had a few weeks to find your feet.

We also offer a generic research training Masters degree programme - **MSc Social Science Research** - that allows you choose any combination of options from across the Faculty. This course is also open to students who want to become applied social science researchers but who do not necessarily have a social science undergraduate degree (applicants with a good undergraduate degree in another discipline plus relevant employment experience, for example, would be considered).

Our core training courses have been developed to the highest standard. They form the foundation for postgraduate MSc degree programmes that have obtained ESRC approval for 1+3 funding - the ultimate badge of quality for postgraduate research training in the UK.
